



LIGHT

When I was young, I taught Physics at Collège Jean-de-Brébeuf, my alma mater. I was hired by the same Jesuit who wrote a letter of recommendation for my application to one of the two 1969 Québec Rhodes Scholarships at Oxford. You have probably noticed my great respect for that religious order. I basically taught two courses, and wrote my own textbooks. One of them I called «Physics of Light». It had a quote from Saint John the Evangelist (in the Orthodox Church he is known as Saint John the Theologian, a



very apt name for him). The quote was «I am the Light of the World», words from Jesus Himself.

This is the time of the year when days are increasing the fastest, when light really takes over from darkness, or dimness. This is the time of the year for the triumph of light.

Light is what permits us to see things clearly. In other words, with light we see things as they really are, without artifice. That light permits us to «call a spade a spade», to really understand what is going on in our world, and so to act as God wants us to act, to follow our mission, the one God wants us to follow. It permits us to discern Satan's crooked ways, and avoid his pitfalls.

Our Creed says of Jesus that He is "Light from Light", echoing Saint John the Theologian (on whose Feast my wife went to Heaven). For us it is essential to live like Him, following His deeds, following His words, letting God take over our lives. We live in difficult times, when so many people have lost all reason for living. We have to provide them with our example, with our encouragement.

This year, at the Easter Vigil at Saint François d'Assise, four young people were baptized, confirmed and received first communion. After the ceremony ended, I noticed that there were others just asking to follow their example. The Christian message is infectious as the Light is shining brighter and brighter. The Catholic Church is not to be confused with Capitalism, or Western Imperialism. The Catholic Church is this movement which follows the Light, Jesus Christ our Lord, who suffered the Cross to show us what love God has for us, and what a Christian life is all about. It is not for nothing that the day following Christmas is the day we celebrate our first martyr, Saint Stephen, who was stoned to death, (nor is it that it is on the day that follows that martyr's that we celebrate Saint John the Theologian).


Please take a list on your way out. We will be collecting items every Sunday until June 1st. If you wish to bring your donations directly to the office, please make arrangements with Joanne.


