

SAINT CONSTANTINE

It is with fondness that I remember my outing to the sugar shack at Saint Constantine organized by Almage in 2019. It was my first trip off the island since 1994.



Who is Saint Constantine? What did he do to be made a saint? If I checked the French monthly «Prions en l'Église» it, roughly translated, says of Saint Constantine the Great. "In the year 313, through the Edict of Milan, Saint Constantine, as the emperor, gave Christians the liberty to profess their faith.... He would have been baptized on his deathbed." He died in 337.

So, we have here, someone who is a saint without being sure that he was a Christian!

There is more. Constantine had a very interesting life. Among other things, since the main countries he fought against were in the Eastern part of the Roman Empire, as was most of its population, he built a new capital on the Bosporus, from what was then the city of Byzantium. That newly expanded city, with all its imperial trappings, he named as his city, i.e. the city of Constantine, which is Constantinople.

He did not just give liberty of religion to Christians, he decided to call a council of all the Christian bishops of the Empire in the city of Nicaea to resolve two dogmas: the Trinity and the two natures of Christ. It seems that he also presided over the discussions on some occasions! What came out of it was the Symbol of Nicaea, which we still profess at Mass today, with an alteration due to Charlemagne (which is not accepted by the Orthodox).

Saint Constantine is celebrated in the Church on May 21, and it seems that the Ecumenical Council of Nicaea started on May 20, 325, that is, 1700 years ago from last Tuesday. By the way, both ancient Constantinople and ancient Nicaea are now called Istanbul and Iznik. Both are in



Türkiye, a mostly Muslim country with very few Christians, but where one still finds the so-called «Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople» Bartholomew, an individual who it seems met Pope Leo XIV a few days ago... and has a very strained relation — to say the least- with the present Patriarch of Moscow and all Russia.

An interesting sidebar to this is the Orthodox sign of the Cross. For it, the faithful use the left hand, to mirror the priest's right-hand sign-of-the-Cross blessing). He puts together the ends of the thumb and the two next fingers (three in one: Trinity) and the two last fingers are against the palm of that hand (the two natures of Christ: divine and human. It is with the three first fingers that you touch your forehead, your lower centre chest, your left and then right upper chest.
