

FRUITS

In the Gospel read on the 25th of the month, Jesus says that you can tell the state of a tree by its fruits: if the tree is good, so will be its fruits; if the tree is rotten, evil, its fruits will be putrid.

Surely this is something we can relate to. I remember in my parents' garden an old apple tree with rotten fruits; I remember a plum tree whose fruits were delicious. One was finally cut down and the other one was kept.

This applies to everything. An individual who double-crosses others is a rotten individual; so is one who does not keep his word, whose group changes its tune from one day to the next. An organization which kills randomly, which destroys schools, places of worship, and tries to erase a people and its history can surely be called a bad fruit.

In the first reading of this same day, God is quoted as saying that the group that I am referring to, its frontiers will be from the Nile to the Euphrates, and that those who bless that group will be blessed by God, and those who do not will have their comeuppance

So here we have a slight problem at this present time. The group which is trying to produce what is prophesized in the first readings is certainly condemned as rotten, evil, by Jesus. On the other hand, our government is backing that same group, and telling us that we must do the same as good citizens.

I understand that killing is reasonable when you are defending your land, your people, your family but is it so when you do so to suppress another people? Unfortunately, this is what happened in the Jewish Bible (and ours).

When a country or a people are attacked, they should defend themselves. But for how long and against who, the attacker's solders, or its innocent citizens. And at what time should they call a halt to the violence?

We seem to be in a conundrum: we are to support that group although Jesus seems to say that its individuals are rotten, as their fruits are murders. It is as if the ones who are to be obliterated are very much less than human and therefore can be slain.

The problem is that this group is basically acting like the «white men» who consider that their way of looking at the world is the right one. They know how to rule the world and no one is allowed to refuse their domination.

Is it not remarkable that more and more priests in the West are now from the third world countries? Is God not trying to tell the West something about the brotherhood of man?

Christians are supposed to proclaim that «God is Love». Jesus is the «Lamb who was slain» to feed all of us. He is the antithesis of human slaughter.
