

MOSES

The first readings at last week's daily masses are about the story of Moses. It starts with a new law or directive given to the peoples living in Egypt: Any Hebrew male infant is supposed to die; only female infants are allowed to live. I must say I find that a very strange method of genocide. That law was initiated by Pharaoh.

In the next part of the story, we find a baby boy born of a Hebrew woman. She, as any mother would, decides to protect her new born; she keeps him hidden at home. Of course, she understands that she cannot keep him hidden forever. She decides to put the child in a little boat on the side of the river, where she hopes that Egyptians might find him. In fact, she has her daughter keep an eye on the baby.

Now the baby is not found by any Egyptian but by Pharaoh's daughter herself! And she understands that the baby is a little Hebrew boy and that he has been left there, seemingly to die. But the Egyptian daughter of Pharaoh is filled with compassion and decides to save the life of the Hebrew child, going against her father's directive. The Hebrew boy, having been adopted by Pharaoh's daughter, is breastfed by a Hebrew woman as a wet nurse. There is an interesting twist here, inasmuch as this wet nurse happens to be Moses' birth mother. She ends up being paid to nurse her own son!

All this is done openly, from what I can tell. Moses is brought up in Pharaoh's court, in full knowledge of his adopted status.



It is interesting that this whole episode is exclusively between women. Women do not seem to be very bloodthirsty, at least not in this case. This is also in line with their physical adaptation: they are the ones who carry babies for nine months in their womb, and then carry their children in their arms and look after them. I do not think that what I write is chauvinism. That is pure and simple biology and study of human behaviour.

There was a kind of collaboration between his biological and adopted mothers: they, as women, understood the value of human life. On the other hand, for a period in his adult life Moses did not.

But, do you not see God at work here? Moses was destined by God to lead his people. But Moses was born to a woman having the lowest status of the people there. And when his life was at stake, Moses was protected by women. At that time the role of the woman was not that of a warrior but rather that of a domestic. See the similarities to that of the early life of Jesus, who also was not born to people in power, but to people who had to flee with Him for His life? It makes you wonder what anyone can accomplish when they put their trust in the Lord.

PRAYER FOR SUMMERTIME

May we walk with God this summer in whatever we do, wherever we go. Protect us God, as we travel, returning us back home safely. Walking with honesty and courage and walking with love, respect, and concern for the feelings of others. May we talk to God this summer — every day and in every situation. Praying words of praise for the beauty of creation, prayers of thanks for friends and good times, asking God's help in all our decisions, and expressing sorrow when we have failed. May we walk and talk with God every day. Amen
