RADOTES* OF SARGENT TURADOTES, HORUS CHARIOTEERS

A fictional representation based on Exodus and 2 Psalms

This is the official report of Sargent Turadotes, about an incident in which Colonel Maximes' Charioteer Regiment was destroyed under awesome circumstances. Turadotes was an engineer affected to that regiment who saw the attack by Maximes against the Hebrew column of slaves escaping from Egypt.

"Colonel Maximes ordered my men to take position on a hill a few thousand paces from the Hebrews on their western flank. We were placed so as to check the road along the southern bank of that East-West branch of the Red Sea. We could also check the other side of that sea branch, about three thousand paces from our position.

Colonel Maximes had basically cornered the Hebrew mob by a pincer movement: a part of our regiment was placed so to attack their southern flank if they decided to move West along that branch of the Red Sea which was stopping their southern advance. The rest was blocking their retreat to the North. The main North-South branch of the Red Sea was stopping them from going West. The Hebrews were thus absolutely trapped, and the next day should see their total annihilation. Colonel Maximes decided to bivouac on these positions, as darkness was coming soon and the troops needed food, water and sleep.

A fierce wind from the East blew all night. The waters of that East-West branch of the Red Sea were in great turmoil, especially its shores that were at their narrowest at that point. It is only slightly before dawn that the wind died down and a radiant sun rose. As dawn appeared, an amazing sight appeared. East-West sandbars appeared bigger and bigger as time passed, with shallow streams of water between them. We noticed that the Hebrew slaves were using them to reach the other side; even their wagons were crossing, going from one sandbar to the next, winding their way. We immediately informed Colonel Maximes of what was happening. Order was given to immediately attack the Hebrew column. Before the order could be executed, we noticed that the size of the sandbanks was starting to diminish, and that the Hebrew rearguard had some trouble walking through them by then. Our first chariots were racing towards them in hot pursuit. The charioteers found it getting more difficult to keep to the sandbars which were getting smaller by the minute; furthermore, the wheels were sinking deeper and deeper in the sand.

As the Hebrew rearguard was reaching the other side and most of our men were getting bogged down in the sand, a bright thunderbolt broke followed by a strong clap of thunder. The horses were terrified, and havoc followed. Worse: a torrential rain started to fall on our troops, such that we could not tell what was going on, except for the cries of our horses and our men. To finish, the earth trembled terribly. In fact, the effect was such that the width of the Red Sea at that place increased by about a thousand paces, which we were able to calculate the next day. The bloated corpses of the whole regiment were found all along the shore. The Hebrews were all on the other side, alive and well. Colonel Maximes had perished at the head of our troops."
