



MY NEWMAN

As you probably noticed last Sunday, I got very emotional when I mentioned that Pope Leo XIV had announced on November 1st that Saint John Henry Cardinal Newman was proclaimed the 38th Doctor of the Church and co-patron of Catholic Education along with Saint Thomas Aquinas, another doctor of the Church. I remember well when Newman was proclaimed a saint by Pope Francis on October 13th, 2019.

In fact, I was very surprised by my emotional reaction, which persists to this day. As you know, I was blessed with a scholarship to study at Oxford. There, as a student, every day I went to mass at the Roman Catholic Chaplaincy, which is dedicated to Saint Thomas More. The original building (which was mostly used for week-day masses and tea while I was there) is called Bishop King's Old Palace (he was the first bishop of Oxford whose Cathedral was also the Chapel (!) of Christ Church College a couple-of-minutes walk away). It is a three-story building constructed around the time when Henry VIII saw to Saint Thomas More's martyrdom. Part of the first floor of it is occupied by a Roman Catholic Bookshop called the Newman Bookshop. You will find a photograph taken by



me in 1974, where you can clearly see its name. Linda and I were married on 30th June 1973 in a new building behind the original one and, one of the three priests con-celebrating then was writing his thesis on Newman.

Newman was a strange character. He was born in 1801. He basically started without a religion and then became an Evangelical member of the Church of England at the age of 15. He was ordained a priest in Christ Church Cathedral on the 29th of May 1825. He, among other things, became a fellow of Oriel College. (My College, Corpus Christi, is contiguous to the other two).

Newman's study of the Church Fathers had a great effect on him. He moved more and more towards what, in England, is called the High Church and became part of the Oxford Movement, discovering the essential role of the Church from her inception, recognizing the necessity of the Apostolic succession through ordinations of priests and bishops, and thus coming closer and closer to Roman Catholicism. Finally, he converted to Roman Catholicism on the 9th of October 1845 while still in England and was ordained a Catholic priest in Rome on May 30th 1847. As a priest, he became a member of the Oratorians, an order created by Saint Philip Neri.

He founded an Oratory in London and another in the city of Birmingham, where he lived for about 40 years. Linda and I stayed a few times in one of its suburbs, with her mother, each time we visited England. Newman wrote extensively on theology and education, and was embroiled in many controversies against anti-papists. He wrote an autobiography, Apologia pro Vita sua, which was published in 1864. He was sent to Ireland for 4 years to establish a Catholic University there. He wrote a lot on education, with his major work on the subject being The Idea of a University. He was made Cardinal by Pope Leo XIII on May 12th 1879, primarily due to his work for the faith in England.

LEST WE FORGET

On November 11, 1918, the Armistice was signed silencing the guns of World War I where between 15 and 22 million people were killed. The Armistice was signed at 5:20AM and became effective on the 11th hour of that day. November 11th has since been renamed Remembrance Day in honour of the millions of troops killed since World War I.



O God, by whose mercy the faithful departed find rest, look kindly on our departed veterans who gave their lives in the service of our country.

Grant that through the passion, death and resurrection of your Son, they may share in the joy of your heavenly kingdom and rejoice in you with your saints forever. Amen.
