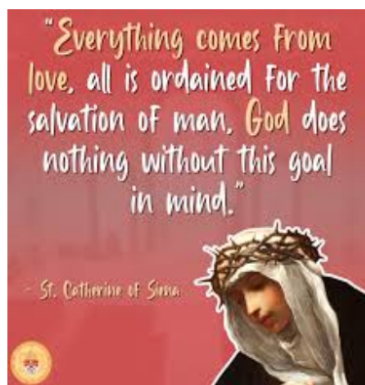
JUDGING

«Do not judge, and you will not be judged.» This might not be the best translation but it was an excerpt from the Gospel from last Monday, June 22nd. By the way, it was the feast day of Saint John Fisher and Saint Thomas More who were both martyred under the orders of Henry VIII. It was also the 75th anniversary of the beginning of World War II operation Barbarossa, the attack on the USSR by the Nazis. It is a day of great sadness in Russia, the beginning of a war where nearly every family lost loved ones...

Jesus, in the Gospel of that day, mentions the plank in the eye of the one who complains of a speck in his neighbour's eye, another way to explain the problem of judging. In fact, this saying of Jesus which I first mentioned had quite an effect on me. At Brébeuf, the dean of studies wanted me to be part of a deontology committee. I was very hesitant but as at first all that was required was providing guidelines; I took notes during a brainstorming session and from that I produced a text that was accepted as I can be a good secretary. Then disaster struck: we were given a case to actually judge! I immediately resigned because of that saying by Jesus, which I take very literally, and seriously understand as an imperative...

You might consider that I am contradicting what I said last week as I mentioned the opinion by Bishop Desmond Tutu claiming that the bar for entry into Heaven is very low. I had given the case of the good thief who asked Jesus to take him in Paradise and was told He would.

I believe that there is a simple way to reconcile these. A rather speculative way, I must admit, and also a rather interesting way as far as I am concerned, especially that it reinterprets in a very different way another saying of Jesus about something which is not forgiven on Earth, will not be forgiven in Heaven; something where it is only if we forgive on Earth that we will be forgiven in Heaven.



May I suggest that Humans are on Earth as a preparation for Heaven. We are made to love each other. We are made to find a partner, love and protect them, have children to love and protect, and then be ready to meet Love Himself. But, on the day that judgment is introduced the wheels come off. At that point, do we contradict the essence of all beings, Love, and miss Heaven completely, and stay frozen for ever? We will not, if we live by Love. However, as soon as we consider another unworthy of love and protection, we end up resigning from Love, and so we take ourselves out from Heaven. So do not judge and it will be said that all's well that ends well. A speculation of course, but one I find satisfying.





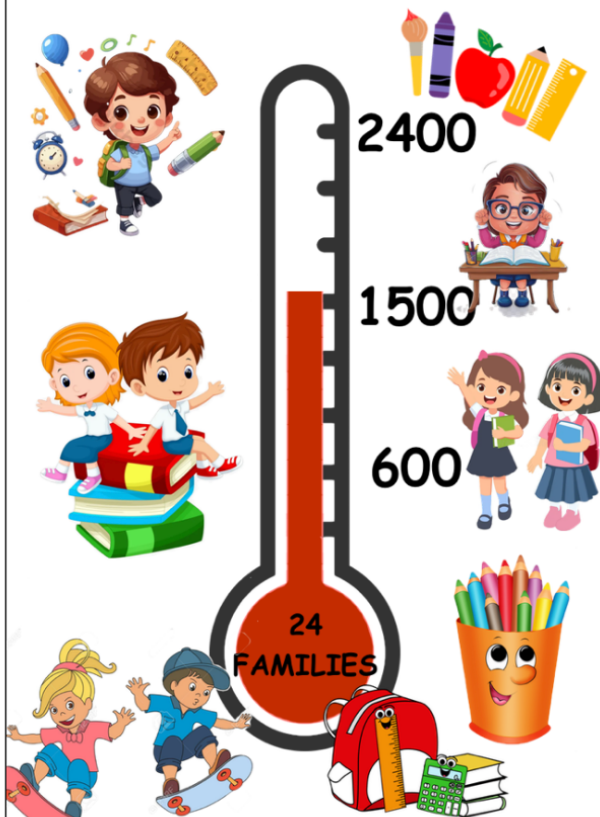
