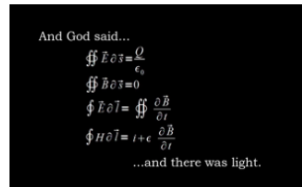

ON FAITH, HOPE AND CHARITY

Let me give you some of my musings about these three «virtues», moral and «theological» qualities, which were mentioned, among others, by Saint Paul in his epistle to the Romans. Hope refers to something in the future; charity refers to something in the present; faith, probably, refers to something in the past. I hope to stay healthy; I hope to go to Heaven; I hope to live in peace. Charity is a term for love of someone. Charity does not include love of something (chocolate cake, for instance) or of some state of being (feeling sated, feeling good). If it is love for someone, present or absent, it still implies some action from the one who loves, so it seems to me to refer to an act taking place in the present, or at least ready to take place.

I suggested that faith has something to do with the past. If one says to have faith in someone, this is based on facts from the past. Someone's past behaviour inspires confidence in his present actions if we have witnessed ourselves that behaviour, and we believe that we have interpreted it correctly. Faith is essential for the engineer. You have to believe that the specifications given to the piece are true to be able to use it correctly. You cannot just hope that it will take the load because it looks good; your hope must be based on faith in the given specifications, based on actual trials.

As you probably know, I taught Physics at the pre-University level. This required the student to have faith in the material I taught. Of course, I was not the only one teaching the laws of Physics; and most of them are quite old, and have found themselves trustworthy.



Our faith is exactly the same. Millions of people have experimented with God in their lives and have found that God's specifications are properly given and that all the experiments can be properly replicated. That indeed God is Love. That His Love is real. That He acts clearly. Our hope that we also can replicate them is therefore guaranteed, and that our hope is valid.



Let me examine a different case. On June 30th, 1973, I married Linda Nadin. I had faith in her character, fidelity, her love for me; and that she wanted to live with me until death. That faith was based on my interaction with her, and our previous life experiences. That she was to live with me until death was my hope: wanting on that day did not give any guarantee. That was just a hope. That I loved her in the sense of charity was a fact at that time; and was reciprocal. Of course, our promises were true because both of us kept them. But that was then just our hope, based on our love, on our faith in each other.

Atheists also have faith; but it is not a faith in God, or what others have lived in their intercourse with God. They share no hope in a life in God; they have no love of God. And this makes their lives all the poorer. They wither like the seed which is not showered by the rain coming from Heaven sown in the ground of Earth.

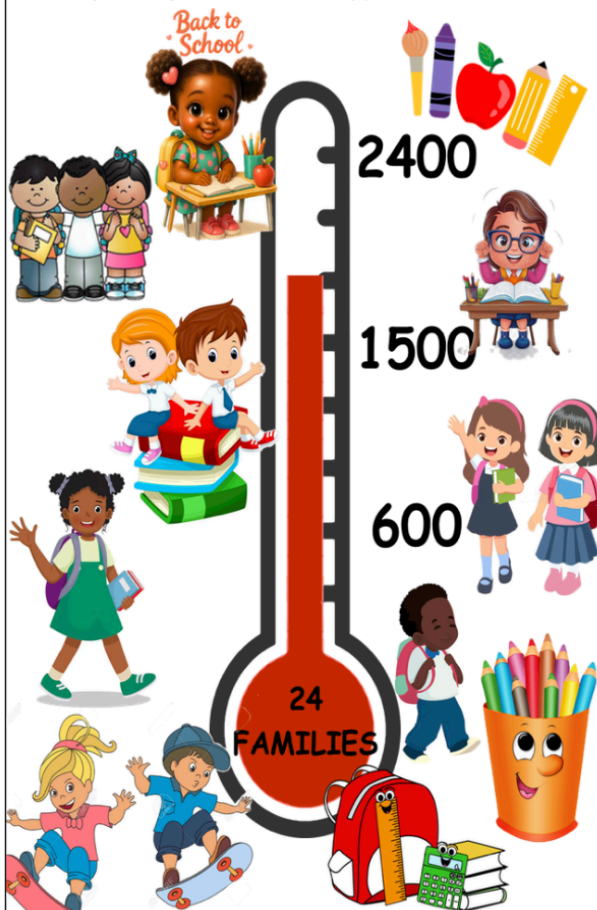

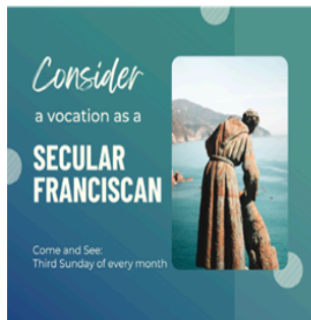

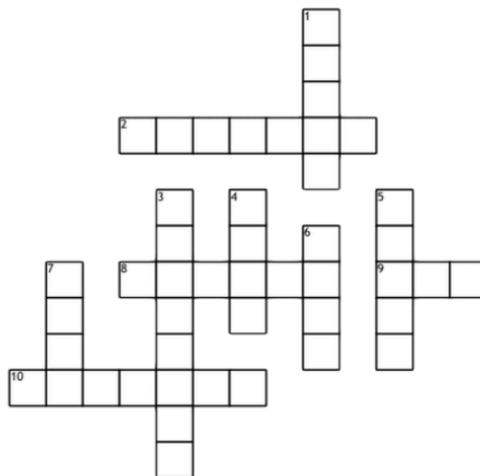
