



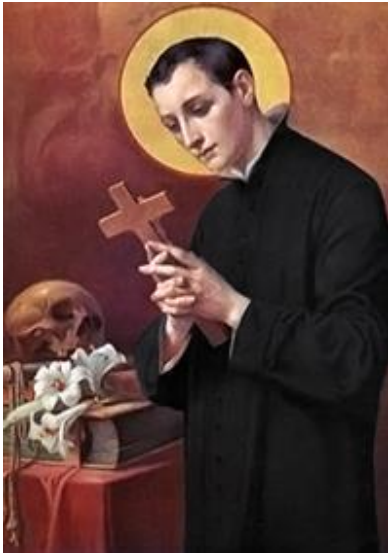

THE H.O.P.E. COMMITTEE: 2020 CHRISTMAS BASKETS AND ADOPT-A-CHILD CAMPAIGN

Given the current pandemic restrictions, we will not be collecting canned goods nor other food items for this year's Christmas Baskets. As an alternative, we will be providing families with food vouchers/gift cards for grocery stores.

Up until last week, we had up to 64 children listed, and additional numbers from another local school pending. As with the food baskets, we will not be purchasing presents this year. The presents will be replaced with gift cards from retail stores *Toys 'R' Us* or *Walmart*. Our goal is to give a \$25 gift card to every child on the list. We encourage you to adopt a child or perhaps more than one if you have the means this Christmas season. If you want to participate in this project, we ask that you put your donation in an envelope labelled ADOPT-A-CHILD in the collection beginning next week and onwards until we've reached our goal. This donation will be included in your tax receipts for 2020. On behalf of these children, we thank you in advance for your kindness.

The members of H.O.P.E. will be purchasing all the food vouchers and gift cards. We want to help keep everyone safe and avoid having our parishioners go to the stores.

ARCHBISHOP CHRISTIAN LÉPINE ISSUES PASTORAL LETTER

**Choosing Hope and Life –
In view of Bill C-7: expanding
access to assisted death**

Following a decision rendered by Quebec Superior Court (September 11, 2019), Parliament is now preparing to pass Bill C-7, which expands the terms of eligibility for "medical assistance in dying" to include persons who, although suffering, may still have many years left to live, and who are not necessarily at the end of life. Archbishop Christian Lépine has issued a pastoral letter reflecting on the repercussions of this bill on individuals, families, and society at large. You are invited to spend an hour with him reflecting on the spiritual, medical and legal perspectives amid this new reality.
